#### 2. INTRODUCTION

In order to focus attention on various issues relating to heritage conservation in the Region, the MMRDA in its meeting held on 30th May, 1996 established by the MMR-Heritage Conservation Society.

Accordingly, the MMR-Heritage Conservation Society was registered under the Societies Registration Act, 1860 on 14th November, 1996 and the Mumbai Public Trust Act, 1950 on 6th February, 1997.

### 3. OBJECTIVES OF THE SOCIETY

The main objectives of the MMR-Heritage Conservation Society are — to promote preservation, conservation, protection, development and improvement of natural, built and related cultural heritage within the area of Mumbai Metropolitan Region (MMR); and to adopt all means to achieve the objects incidental or ancillary to the attainment of the main objects including but not restricted to the following:

# **Developing a Data Base for Mumbai Metropolitan Region:**

- To conduct studies/surveys of buildings, artefacts, structures and precincts of historical/ aesthetic / architectural / cultural value;
- To undertake systematic listing of heritage buildings and precincts as well as identifying the components of natural / cultural heritage which needs to be conserved;
- To compile and store data on heritage, including digital database conversion by using advanced techniques such as computerized optical image processing;
- To set up a full-fledged resource centre including library, material documentation and photo-documentation centre on heritage conservation.

# **Training, Education and Awareness:**

- To encourage the architectural educational institutions by undertaking training programmes in heritage conservation and carrying out documentation of heritage buildings and precincts in MMR;
- To organize training programmes for local authorities for developing capabilities in undertaking heritage conservation related activities;
- To sponsor candidates for participating in training courses in India/abroad for architectural students and local authority staff in heritage conservation and related subjects;
- To publish a journal and organize other publications on various aspects related to heritage conservation;

 To promote awareness about heritage conservation movement by educating general public as well as students at the school level, by organizing exhibitions/competitions on heritage conservation.

# **Providing Financial Assistance to Conservation:**

- To finance the programmes for maintenance of heritage buildings/precincts/ artefacts;
- To finance the programmes leading to preservation and conservation of natural heritage such as coastal areas, lakes, rivers, forests, hills and hill stations, etc.;
- To finance the programmes of preservation and conservation of settlements of cultural and historical significance.
- To promote networking of various agencies in MMR including local historical societies, NGO's and professionals.

Jurisdiction of the Society is the Mumbai Metropolitan Region (MMR) area. The project proposals are invited in the format prescribed by the Society from Local bodies, University, Colleges, Societies, Institutions, Voluntary Organizations, NGOs and intellectual individuals working in the field of heritage conservation.

During the last 15 years, the MMR-Heritage Conservation Society has supported 56 projects with approved cost of Rs.6.22 crores involving survey, documentation, guidelines for major heritage buildings and precincts and implementation of actual conservation / restoration of heritage structures. Some of the important completed projects are: Conservation guidelines for Khotachiwadi Precinct; Opera House Precinct; Marine Drive Precinct; Mahatar Pakhadi Precincts; Bandra Precinct; Cumballa Hill Precinct; Khodadad Circle, Parsi Colony, Hindu Colony Precincts; Ballard Pier Precinct; Guidelines for heritage buildings in Thane, Kalyan, Matheran and Navi Mumbai Notified area; Comprehensive Listing and Grading of Heritage Structures and Precincts in Greater Mumbai; Documentation and Conservation Guidelines for Heritage Buildings and Precincts in Vasai-Virar Sub-Region; Listing and Conservation Plan for Fountains and Pyaavs in the City of Mumbai; Conservation of Ballard Bunder Gate house and Bombay Castle wall located at Naval Dockyard; Convocation Hall of Mumbai University, Meeting Hall of Matheran Hill Station Municipal Council, Wilson College and David Sassoon Library. The Society had also organized a week-long Training programme in Heritage Conservation for senior officers/Engineers/Architects dealing with the maintenance of buildings of Local and public authorities in the Mumbai Metropolitan Region. The Society has released financial assistance of Rs. 4.52 crores for the projects so far.

### 4. ACTIVITIES DURING THE YEAR 2011-12.

#### 4.1 NEW PROJECT PROPOSAL

During the year 2011-12, the Society received four proposals for funding which were scrutinized by the Sub-Committee of the Society. Out of this two proposals are under consideration and on the recommendation of the Sub-Committee, the Board of Governors rejected funding two project proposals.

# 4.2 ON-GOING PROJECTS

The Board of Governors / Sub-Committee of the Society reviewed the progress reports of the following on-going projects:

• Consultancy project on "Listing and Grading of Heritage Buildings & Precincts in Urban and Rural Areas of Thane and Raigad District in MMR not covered in earlier listing exercises (Task I,II,III,IV)"

The above project was approved by the Board of Governors in January 2009 on consultancy basis on the terms and conditions similar to the earlier listing project of Greater Mumbai.

Heritage lists have been prepared for several areas in MMR. However large parts of areas like Alibaug, Pen, Karjat, Khopoli, Neral, Kulgaon-Badlapur, Ambernath, Bhiwandi, Taluka, Mira-Bhayander, NMMC areas and rural areas of Thane and Raigad districts were yet to be covered for heritage listing. The main objective of the project is to cover these areas and document and list the heritage assets in these areas.

The project was divided into four tasks and following consultants were appointed in September 2009.

The work commenced in September 2009 and the first stage report was reviewed. Envirodesigners and Adarkar Associates have completed the Stage 3 i.e. the Draft Heritage List with proposed grading along and detailed documentation of the sites. The Sub-Committee reviewed the work on 24<sup>th</sup> November, 2011. Both the Consultants have also uploaded the data to the Heritage Information System.

# • Consultancy project on "Preparation of Action Plan for Conservation of Heritage Precincts in MMR (Task-I,II,III,V)"

A proposal for undertaking a project on preparation of Action Plan for conservation of the Heritage Precincts in MMR on consultancy basis was approved by the Board of Governors of the Society in December 2008.

The Heritage Regulations at present does not state specific guidelines for the conservation of Heritage Precincts in the city. Each Heritage Precinct has a unique architectural character and requires specific development regulations. It is also important to understand that all issues of the precinct cannot be addressed with help of only development control regulations.

There is thus a need to develop a comprehensive plan which combines legislative mechanisms, specific projects and programmes and financial strategies to conserve these precincts. The projects and programmes can be prioritized for developing an action plan.

The project was initiated by the MMR-Heritage Conservation Society as a pilot to develop strategies for conservation of Heritage Precincts in the MMR. Five precincts were shortlisted from a list of 80 precincts across MMR and five consultants were appointed in January, 2010.

The work on the project began in March 2010. The Consultants have completed the work upto the Stage 5 i.e. the Preparation of Action Plan for the project and the work reports were reviewed by the Sub-Committee 65th and 66th Sub-Committee meetings.

# "Development of Software on Heritage Information System in MMR". – By C-DAC.

The Board of Governors approved this project on 22<sup>nd</sup> December, 2008 for a cost of Rs.21.5 lakhs.

The main scope of the project includes developing an internet based Heritage Information System through developing and deploying a software tool that will facilitate the tasks of digitization, cataloguing, management and dissemination of information of heritage assets in MMR.

The work of the project commenced in March, 2009 and a web-based framework to enter new data from the listing project has been set up, which would create a searchable data-base for all new documentation. The consultants are uploading the new data of the Heritage sites identified through the Consultancy project on "Listing and Grading of Heritage Buildings & Precincts in Urban and Rural Areas of Thane and Raigad District in MMR not covered in earlier listing exercises. The M.C. MMRDA launched the website on 2<sup>nd</sup> February, 2012 in the 38<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Board of Governors of MMR-Heritage Conservation Society.

### 4.3 CONCLUDED PROJECTS.

# Project regarding "Documentary Film on Heritage Awareness of Caves in MMR"- by Design Plus

The Board of Governors in its meeting held on 18<sup>th</sup> January 2010 approved the above mentioned project and decided to provide financial assistance of Rs. 1,30,000/- for the first phase of the project to undertake research, develop script and to finalize the story for duration of 2 months.

The main objective of the project is to undertake research on various cave sites in MMR (historical background, art, architecture & present status, etc) and make a documentary film of 30 min duration. The movie will help create an understanding of the rich heritage of the caves in and around Mumbai amongst the citizens of the city. The Sub-Committee reviewed the script and story board of the project in the 64<sup>th</sup> and 66<sup>th</sup> Sub-Committee meeting and recommended the conclusion of the first phase of the project.

The first phase of the project was concluded in the 38<sup>th</sup> Meeting of the Board of Governors on 2<sup>nd</sup> February 2012.

# • Consultancy project on "Preparation of Action Plan for Conservation of Heritage Precincts for Jama Masjid Precinct (Task-IV)"

The above project was part of the consultancy project on "Preparation for Conservation of Heritage Precincts in MMR." The work on the project began in March 2010. The Consultants carried out the work on the Stage 1- Inception report and the Stage 2 – Detailed Condition Assessment. The work report for Stage 2 was reviewed by the Sub-Committee on 24<sup>th</sup> September, 2010; 8<sup>th</sup> February, 2011 and on 25<sup>th</sup> April, 2011. However the Sub-Committee found the work extremely unsatisfactory as the report was unable to capture the heritage value of the site through its documentation. Hence after repeated attempts by the Consultants, the Sub-Committee decided to terminate the consultancy work and conclude the project.

#### 5. TRAINING AND AWARENESS PROGRAMMES

# • Financial assistance for Kalighat Paintings Exhibition

The Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj Vastu Sangrahalaya hosted a touring exhibition of Kalighat paintings from the Victoria & Albert Museum London and Victoria Memorial Hall from 21<sup>st</sup> December, 2011 to 1<sup>st</sup> February, 2012. The Exhibition was a part of the Co-operative initiative of the Ministry of Culture, Government of India and Victoria & Albert Museum London and was also on display at the Victoria Memorial Hall, Kolkatta; Salar Jung Museum, Hydrabad and N.G.M.A., New Delhi. A financial support of Rs. 2 lakh was provided by the MMR-Heritage Conservation Society for this exhibition since the activity was conducted by the museum to promote awareness and the larger benefit of the people in the city.

#### 6. PUBLICATIONS

Material and data generated from the documentation process as well as evaluation and formulation of the guidelines is being published in the form of reports, users' manuals and hand-books. These publications would be in local languages and profusely illustrated in order to make them accessible for wide range of people in the City.

The following manuals are published and available with the Society.

- Conservation Guidelines for Khotachiwadi Academy of Architecture.
- Design handbook for the provision of heritage sensitive street furniture and signage for D. N. Road streetscape – Ms. Abha N. Lambah, Mumbai.

- Conservation Guidelines for Opera House Precinct by Ms. Sandhya Savant, Mumbai.
- Stone cleaning in the context of architectural conservation in Mumbai by A.C.C. Ltd., Mumbai.

#### 7. FUNDS

During the year 2011-2012, the Society had received **Rs. 75,49,563/-** by way of interest from the investment of interest free loan and surplus funds and an amount of **Rs. 60,86,662/-** was released as grant to the approved project and administrative expenses.
